Pat started with the Council as a call responder for the 24-hour Helpline and joined the WCPG Board in 2009. Pat is a therapist who works with those who are affected by gambling disorders.
- **Special Recognition Award presented to LeAnn Holden of Waupun.** LeAnn has been involved with the Wisconsin Council on Problem Gambling for several years, sharing her the story of her struggle with gambling at many training sessions and at the statewide conference.
- **Special Recognition Award presented to Sharon Guyette of Green Bay.** Sharon has been a tremendous supporter of the work that is being done by the council for a number of years.
